

Nimrod, the Spirit of Antichrist (part 3)

There is an astounding prophetic message pertaining to both Christ and antichrist found in the genealogy of Genesis, which has appeared in our previous studies. The meanings of the names from Adam to Nimrod present us with a message that only God himself could have designed. It is once again proof positive of the divine authorship of the holy scriptures. There are other ministries that have revealed this amazing hidden prophecy, but they stopped their findings at Noah and continued no further. To understand the full message embedded in Genesis we must go a few generations beyond that. Here is the genealogical list of names found in Genesis chps. 5 & 10 with each of their meanings. The meanings to each name can be verified using the bible dictionary study tools found at the following website: <http://www.bible-history.com/>. I've also included the definitions found in the book, The Exhaustive Dictionary of Bible Names to offer a more complete meaning to some. The meanings vary only slightly from one source to another so here is compiled the general meanings of each in their order:

1. Adam – earthy, red earth; of the ground; taken out of the earth
2. Seth – appointed
3. Enos – man; man in his frailty; feeble, mortal
4. Cainan – possessor; acquisition; purchaser; a purchase; being purchased
5. Mahalaleel – praise of God; praiser of God; God is splendor
6. Jared – descent, descending; he who descends
7. Enoch – initiated; initiating; teacher; dedicated; consecrated; experienced
8. Methuselah – when he dies it shall be sent; i.e. the flood (root = to be cast out; messenger of death)
9. Lamech – poor; made low. Reduced
10. Noah – rest; comfort; comforter
11. Ham – heat; hot; warm; black; dark (root = to wax warm; to wax hot; to inflame)
12. Cush – a black countenance; full of darkness; black (root = to scorch) Ethiopia.
13. Nimrod – rebel; a rebel; to be rebellious; valiant; strong; he who rules. We will rebel.

If we start from the beginning the message goes:

Out of the earth there is appointed a man in his frailty to purchase to the praise of God when he descends as the consecrated teacher. And when he dies it shall be sent to the poor who are made low to give them rest and comfort from the dark day of heat when a man of black countenance and full of darkness will rebel and rule.

As said before, you can verify for yourself the meanings listed by using some online study tools. God himself, using the names from Adam to Nimrod, has embedded a coded message of both the gospel of Jesus Christ, and a prophetic revelation concerning the coming antichrist.

Jesus is called “the last Adam” in 1 Cor. 15:45 so it is only fitting that the first man Adam should represent the coming of Christ in the earth. “But when the fulness of the time was come, God sent forth his Son, made of a woman (of the earth), made under the law, to redeem (purchase) them that were under the law, that we might receive the adoption of sons.” (Gal. 4:3-5) This is the exact message given in the names of Genesis, only worded differently. It says that those that are low, the poor, are given “rest.” Isn’t that the exact message that Jesus gave in the gospels? “Blessed are the poor in spirit: for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.” (Matt. 5:3) “Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest.” (Matt. 11:28)

It is during the time of the Church era that man is able, by the grace of God, to enter into his divine rest and comfort thru the new covenant in Christ. “For he that is entered into his rest, he also hath ceased from his own works, as God did from his. Let us labour therefore to enter into that rest...” (Heb. 4:10-11) Just as the Christian must faithfully obey the command of the Lord and pick up their cross and follow the Lord unto salvation, “By faith Noah, being warned of God of things not seen as yet, moved with fear, prepared an ark to the saving of his house; by the which he condemned the world, and became heir of the righteousness which is by faith.” (Heb. 11:7)

Therefore Noah, as “a preacher of righteousness” (2 Pet. 2:5), and who “found grace in the eyes of the Lord” (Gen. 6:8), represents the few elect of God in the Church who will be spared from the coming day of destruction at the end of the age. Noah and the destruction of the flood are used many times in scripture to portray the coming day of destruction in the future, but this time by fire. This coming fiery destruction is subsequently shown with Noah’s son, Ham, whose name means: heat; hot; warm; black; dark (root = to wax warm; to wax hot; to inflame) So just after the time of “rest” and “comfort” during ‘the age of Grace’ comes the dark day of heat. Soon thereafter, a black countenance; full of darkness will arise. Yes, you read that correctly. I’m not making this up. It’s given right in the dictionary sources for the name Cush, and the sequence of the generations from Adam are right there in the bible.

At the present time in the United States (Babylon the great) there sits in the oval office (which represents the eye of Lucifer) a man of “black countenance”, who is no doubt also “full of darkness”. He is the modern “king of Babylon.” It is next in the sequence that Nimrod, the rebel, comes forth. Is this more confirmation to what we have seen concerning Lucifer and “the beast”? Is the man of “black countenance” going to be filled with the spirit of Nimrod to rule the world in utter rebellion against God and Christ?
